Room with a view



A good view can make all the difference to a stabled pony. A half hay ring like this can give smaller residents the chance to see what's going on, as well as giving them a bit more space.

Hayball



A hay ball can increase the time it takes for a horse to eat their forage rations, keeping them occupied for longer.

Molasses Lolly



A suspended horse ball coated with a treat like molasses can keep a horse on box rest busy for hours! With quite a bit ending up on their face though!



Horses, ponies and donkeys love a good scratch! Fix old broom heads to the wall or along a beam so they can indulge whenever they like!

Scratching Post

Being able to see, hear and smell other horses can help relax a stabled equine, but they will still miss out on that all important physical interaction. Design stables so that horses can choose to interact – or not – as they prefer.

Stable Mirror

Nothing beats real friendship, but a stable mirror can help horses feel that they're not alone. Introduce mirrors carefully to make sure the horse isn't fearful of it or aggressive to their new 'friend'.
